# 3.3 Breeding Raptor Surveys

### 3.3.1 2021

No raptors were confirmed breeding within 2km of the site. Red kite, osprey, buzzard and kestrel were recorded foraging or commuting within the survey area during the breeding season but no breeding territories were recorded.

#### 3.3.2 2022

No raptors were confirmed breeding within 2 km of the site. Red kite, buzzard and kestrel were recorded foraging or commuting within the survey area during the breeding season but no breeding territories were recorded. There was also a single golden eagle recorded commuting over site in April, and a single short-eared owl was also recorded, flying north in late April.

## 3.4 Black Grouse Surveys

No black grouse were recorded on site during black grouse surveys in 2021 or during any other surveys in 2021 and 2022. The site has poor potential for black grouse leks, as although there is abundant open ground available there is an absence of optimal breeding habitat nearby.

Subsequently, there has been an incidental record during an ecology walkover survey of a single female black grouse flying west over site between Sauchanwood Hill and Mickle Corum, on 16 October 2023, approximately 1km from the nearest proposed turbine location. This indicates that black grouse are present in the wider area.

# 4.0 Legal, Conservation and Site Status of Bird Species
